## **Public Relations**

### **A. Activities Performed for 2010**

**1/7:** Lt. Dan McGee re-certified the employee's of Fountain City Chiropractic in CPR and AED. A DVD was shown and Annie's were used to practice the technique.

**1/8:** Lt. Dan McGee gave a RAD demonstration to various martial arts instructors and Pil-Sung martial arts. Lt. McGee went over women's and officer self defense.

**2/8:** Chief Lehman along with Sheriff Kevin Beck spoke at the Williams County Senior Center, Montpelier site. They both spoke on personal and home security. They also touched on fraud prevention. This lasted 30 min.

**2/22:** Lt. Dan McGee gave a presentation to the Girls Scouts at St. Paul's church. He gave a 1 hour session on personal safety, personal safety weapons, pepper spray, tasers, and self defense.

**2/23:** Chief Lehman attended the Officer Phil Safety Program lasting 45 minutes with 2 sessions. The program was presented by a representative of the Officer Phil Safety Program. This presentation was given to the Montpelier Elementary School. This was also a sponsored event by the police department through financial donations from local businesses.

**3/23:** R/Ptl. Darrin Repp attended a weather spotting training put on by the National Weather Service. Area fire fighters and law enforcement along with the general public attended.

**4/1:** Lt. Dan McGee gave a 1 hour session on Bullying and Angry Behaviors to the Little Lights Day Care. They watched a video on Anti-Bullying and toured the department. A pencil and police sticker badges was handed out.

**4/7:** Chief Jeff Lehman, Lt. Dan McGee, R/Ptl. Garret Humbarger attended the Mock Crash put on for Williams County juniors and seniors. This was sponsored by the Williams County Safe Communities Coalition. A Mock Crash with role players were acted out.

**4/29:** Chief Jeff Lehman and A/A Darrin Repp attended a Records Training class that was conducted by the State of Ohio Auditors Office. Topics included public records request and records retention.

**5/3:** R/Ptl. Darrin Repp, R/Ptl. Sam Santa-Rita, R/Ptl. James Clark, R/Ptl. Tarah Landis helped take trash for citizens out to the curb for large trash pick up

**5/11:** Lt. Dan McGee did a self defense demonstration for the Delta Kappa Gamma (Teachers Sorority) held in Napoleon. The demonstration included items from R.A.D. and a pamphlet with this information was handed out.

**5/13:** Chief Jeff Lehman, Lt. Dan McGee, Sgt. Jennifer Hern, Ptl. Duaine Cluckey all attended the open house for Evergreen Manor Nursing Home's grand opening celebration from their remodeling projects.

**5/19:** Chief Jeff Lehman, Lt. Dan McGee, Ptl. Matt Collins, A/A Darrin Repp gave tours of the department for Kindergarten classes of the Montpelier Schools. There were 4 groups with two sessions in the morning and two in the afternoon. Coloring books, badge stickers and rulers were handed out to the kids.

**5/19:** Lt. Dan McGee spoke to the Mayors Association about the Williams County Crime Stoppers and how it affects police work. Business cards and posters were handed out to the Mayors.

**5/20:** Lt. Dan McGee gave a self-defense, awareness, and escaping grabs demonstration to the 6<sup>th</sup> grade at Montpelier Schools.

**6/21:** Lt. Dan McGee, Sgt. Darrell Higbie, and RPtl. Darrin Repp took part in the Special Olympics Torch Run. This torch run is held all across the State of Ohio with different law enforcement officials taken part. This was the Williams County portion with other law enforcement agencies in the county taking part. The run started at the Montpelier Police Department to Howald Field House from there Sgt. Higbie and RPtl. Repp biked to SRT in Bryan. Then continued on to the Williams County Court House where a ceremony was held. Lt. McGee provided escort with a cruiser the entire course of travel.

**7/24:** The entire department took part in the Bean Days Parade. This included all fulltime and reserve officers. We provided traffic control for the event.

**8/3:** Lt. Dan McGee gave a tour of the department, explained street safety, bike safety, stop signs and stop light safety to Safety Town. Handouts to the kids included rulers, safety coloring books and stickers. Also a game of red light/green light was played in the parking lot.

**8/6:** Little Lights Daycare were on a scavenger hunt through out the village. They were to solve clues to find out where there next stop was going to be. RPtl. Darrin Repp gave them a brief tour of the department and handed out Sticker badges as they were to collect something from every place visited.

**8/31:** Lt. Dan McGee attended and participated in the Williams Co. Summit on Children. This is a networking event for resources available to agencies

for children. Topics discussed were Dolly Parton Imagination Library services of the United Way, GateKeepers program against teen depression, and the SOARS program which is in use in the North Central School District. Others attending the event was county law enforcement agencies, school administrators, social workers, guidance counselors, and other various agencies.

**9/15:** Lt. Dan McGee spoke at Ladies Day at the Williams County Fair. The topic was on personal protection, risk awareness, and risk assessment. A booklet on Ohio Victim Crimes, a pamphlet on R.A.D. developed by Lt. McGee, a risk assessment check sheet, and business cards were handed out.

**9/21:** Lt. Dan McGee spoke to the Bryan Senior Housing tenants. The topic of discussion was personal protection, risk awareness and assessment, and self defense options for seniors. Several informational pamphlets were handed out.

**9/28:** Lt. Dan McGee spoke to the Church of the Latter Day Saints (Bryan), Women's Relief Group. The topic of discussion included personal protection, risk awareness and assessment, self defense options, holiday season protection, and identity theft. Several pamphlets were handed out on each of the topics.

**9/27,9/28,9/29:** Lt. Dan McGee began his R.A.D. classes at Montpelier High School. The presentation was given in the girls PE class freshmen and sophomores. This is the class portion with Lt. McGee going over a booklet designed by him and, drills were performed.

**10/1:** Lt. Dan McGee taught a RAD self defense class at Montpelier Schools to freshmen and sophomore girls in their PE class. Booklets were handed out with information on the topic.

**10/6:** Lt. Dan McGee spoke with the Montpelier Schools staff reference drug culture and youth. Pamphlet on drugs was handed out.

**10/11:** Lt. Dan McGee held a RAD simulation training for the freshmen and sophomore girls at Montpelier Schools. The girls got a chance to practice all that Lt. McGee had taught throughout his classes. A/A Darrin Repp assisted with the simulations.

**10/25:** Lt. Dan McGee spoke at the Bryan High School Parents Guidance Night. He spoke at two sessions with the first being on Cyber Bullying and the second on Drug and Alcohol. A power point was shown developed by Dan McGee/PTL System LLC. Also handouts on drug trend developed by Lt. McGee.

**10/26:** Lt. Dan McGee spoke to the first and second graders at Montpelier Schools. The topic was drug awareness and how to say “No.”

**10/28:** Lt. Dan McGee spoke to the third and sixth grade at Montpelier Schools. The topic was drug awareness and how to say “No.”
